Please take note of the following school dress code:

Pupils are expected to look neat and tidy at all times with shirts tucked in, top buttons done up and ties correctly tied. Girls are **not** permitted to wear nail varnish of any colour/shade or make up of any description and if they do come to school wearing either it will be removed. There should be no jewellery, wrist bands or friendship bracelets. No body piercing is permitted, other than ear lobes. If girls do have pierced ears, they may wear one pair of small ear studs **only** but they must be removed for PE and Games. No other types of earring are allowed since they pose a health and safety risk. No extreme hair styles will be permitted; girls with long hair **must** tie it back. Boys hair should be tidy and **not** touching the collar.

Gel is not allowed in school. Any hair dyes or tints must be close to the student's natural colour.

It would be greatly appreciated if parents could reinforce the dress codes with their children.

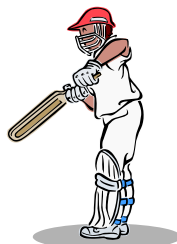


Wednesday 16th June—Gardening Morning. If you can spare some time to join our working party, do stay after morning drop off.

McMonagle and Harriott-Gayle Stun Boxhill

Jake McMonagle and Ainsley Harriott-Gayle put on a record second wicket partnership for Burys Court/Moon Hall as they chalked up an unbroken 84 stand in Moon Hall's 113 for 1 against Boxhill on Wednesday to open up this season's campaign. Boxhill never quite recovered from a dreadful start as McGonagle then dismantled the top order with three wickets in one over, Moon Hall eventually winning the game by 17 runs.

In a game reduced to thirteen overs-a-side, Moon Hall got off to a great start with skipper Freddie Leveson and McMonagle putting on 29 by the end of the fourth over before the captain chopped on. The stage was then set for the partnership of the match.

McMonagle played some terrific strokes off the back foot and, despite some seriously pacey bowling, pulled three mighty sixes to go with his six fours. Harriott-Gayle, a batsman in the classical tradition, was less violent but more orthodox than McMonagle and, looking every inch a batsman of the highest class, was soon into his stride, timing the ball superbly and ending up on 29 not out which included one six and three fours. McMonagle finished with an undefeated 69, the highest individual score for Burys Court/Moon Hall since Oliver Williams' famous 71 against Belmont in June 1996.

Despite striking the opening delivery of the innings for 6, Boxhill's Ramdin was then needlessly run out and then the wheels really fell off when McGonagle took the ball. Box Hill's top order was then blown apart in the second over; McMonagle's second delivery uprooted Rutherford's off stump and then Robey -a top quality cricketer- was bowled by one that kept low. The next delivery accounted for Winter and, to all intents and purposes, Boxhill's goose had already been cooked.

A spirited partnership of 57 for the fifth wicket against Moon Hall's second stream bowlers lifted Boxhill's spirits but, thanks to tight second spells from a pacey Harriott-Gayle and the irrepressible McMonagle augmented by two well controlled overs from James Fitzgibbons, Boxhill found themselves 85 for 4 with just two overs to go. Into the breach came two more promising Moon Hall bowlers Christopher Cross and Wesley Musgrove. With the fifth wicket firing on all cylinders, Cross -under real pressure- delivered the perfect over; although a wicket less one, every ball was on a good length and the over yielded a mere four runs. Musgrove then made up for a torrid over earlier on by bowling Barrat and conceded just seven runs to ensure a victory that would have been even more conclusive if all our catches had been held.

There is an air of confidence in the Moon Hall camp as the team prepare for their next home match against Canbury School on Wednesday.
