

Lineham and Loft star in dazzling start to season!

The Bury's Court football season got off to a truly amazing start on Wednesday against Ewell Castle when our boys pulled off an extraordinary comeback in a thrilling match characterised by skill, great team work and -above all- sheer speed.

On a warm, bright afternoon, our team consisting of a mixture of Year Five and Six pupils, was up against a unit solely made up of Year Sixes. In the first minute, it was obvious that the BC coach had badly underestimated the strength of his own team as BC kept its width, passed, ran into space and called for the ball -attributes that were missing all too often last season. What particularly caught the eye in the opening moments was the excellent ball control. However, despite two great left footed shots at goal by left wing back Tarran Lineham, within ten minutes BC were 2-0 down although one of those was a penalty courtesy of a hand ball in the box. Then Lineham, running at terrific pace, took possession and passed to William Goudie at centre forward who smashed it straight into the net.

Two more Ewell goals followed then Lineham again sprinted with the ball and shot a bullet from twenty yards which sizzled over the head of the hapless goal keeper into the net. Nevertheless, goal keeper Liam Patel was on several occasions compelled to show great courage, anticipation and skill as Ewell Castle kept winning the ball. Still, at half-time, 4-2 was still an unwanted (and thoroughly unmerited) scoreline.

The second half, however, suddenly reminded us all of why our hockey players were so brilliant last season. At the end of twenty mind boggling minutes, Bury's Court were shaking hands with the opposition having won 6-4...Yes won 6-4!! The four goals were all stunners. Lineham pounced on the ball and again passed it to Goudie who thumped in goal number three. Sixty seconds later, centre mid-field Oscar Loft, speedy in his own right, produced two goals of his own both of which were the results of magnificent and typically unselfish passing from new skipper right wing back George Mustchin. The second of these goals showed how mature and level headed Loft has become as a sportsman; he could see the goalkeeper bracing himself for another thunderbolt so -in the blink of an eye- he used the outside of his right foot and dribbled it past the goalie's left as the poor chap was literally transferring his weight onto his *right*. To add to this brilliance, Loft spent that second half geeing up his players - such is his spirit and determination. Captain Mustchin scored another goal minutes later and then it was all over.

The team as a whole had produced a fantastic performance. Left back Arun Watkins' natural skills were obvious yet George Tuson also fought like a tiger as right back. Peter Fitzgibbons passed as a back to the wingers and both Nick Gill and Edward Wilkinson produced great moments.

Special mention has to be made of Lineham. His energy and speed were outstanding and his control of the ball makes me grateful that he is on our side.

The speed of the turnaround underlined the boys' "Never say die" attitude -a truly wonderful quality of which we should all be proud. Perhaps the confidence of now being a successful sporting school has rubbed off into our soccer. After years of being on the wrong ends of defeats, we are now winning and winning well. That makes it all so, so, so much sweeter! The boys' confidence and enjoyment will only increase all the more-and that's what we are all here to see!
