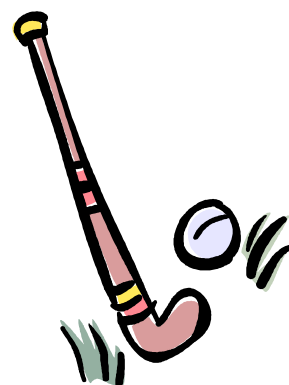

Indeed, our shape was decidedly poor in the first half, two of our mid-fielders allowing themselves to be drawn into the middle rather than staying wide. Skipper Oscar Loft, as centre mid-field, can feel rightly aggrieved by this serious error -something that must be addressed immediately if we are to win our last two games.

Corbyn Johannes' tackling was terrific and he too marked well. He worked particularly well in the second half, often calling for the ball from right mid-field George Mustchin. Joseph McLaughlin is learning fast; he also played well when BC attacked the short corners.

The first half was extremely close but first blood was drawn by Felton Fleet. It was, perhaps, the goal of the season, a cross from the right being deflected by the striker who didn't even stop the ball. It was in the net in the blink of an eye!

The second half saw BC re-gain their shape -at least, for the most part. With the clock ticking by, two of the three backs came up to augment BC's attacks. We had Felton Fleet on the back foot for much of the second half but suddenly, the FF striker took the ball and passed into the centre to one of two opposition players lurking behind our backs. McLaughlin was facing three men on his own and even Liam Patel couldn't prevent what can only be described as a soft goal.

But -you should know this team by now! Did the heads drop? Of course not! Frustration was coming to the boil so the irrepressible Loft took matters into his own hands. In the dying seconds, thanks to a speedy pass from the excellent sub Marcus Malley, the captain weaved his way through three defenders and scored one of his easiest goals. I looked at his face, as he was pulling the trigger. This young lad knew that a draw was now very unlikely. He was disappointed -so was I. We had not done ourselves justice. We might be starting to think about the end of term coming up and the Easter holidays but let me assure you of this! It is far from our minds! We want to win our last two matches -and win them well. If Mustchin can re-gain his otherwise phenomenal form, if we improve our work on the left wing and ensure that we are in the D in the right times, then this will happen. We must sort out those "if's. The next two weeks will be the most important that this squad will have ever experienced so far in the two years in which the players have been together.

Tickets will be £5.00 per adult and £3.00 per child.

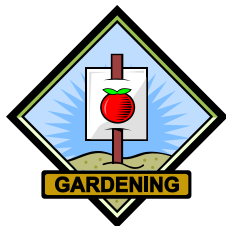
Please send your request for tickets into the school office with payment (cheques made payable to MHSET).
