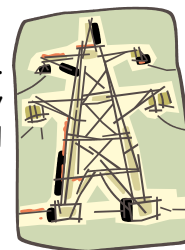

Appointments and Absence

At the beginning of term 11 students from College were brave enough to accompany Mr Simpson and Mrs Jamieson to Yorkshire on a Geography GCSE field trip for 4 days. We were blessed with warm dry weather which made looking at the landscape so much more enjoyable. We did see plenty of limestone in the Yorkshire Dales National Park, particularly walking round the stunning Malham area. We also saw it being quarried with a tour of one of Tarmac's biggest quarries in the country. Finally we went underground at Stump Cross Caverns to see the stalactites and stalagmites and other wonderful formations. There was Human Geography too, considering honey pot tourist sites such as Grassington and Malham village, the problems of transport in the Aire valley and on the way there, we looked at a redevelopment scheme along the banks of the River Aire in Leeds. What was the highlight of the trip? Was it Meadowhall shopping Centre where we stopped on the way there, which provided a useful break and a chance to see what the impact of this Centre has been on the economy of the area? For one student it was the film they went to see one evening at the quaint 1930's cinema in Keighley, but it was set in a favela in Rio so even that was Geography.
